



Sick Policy

Redeemer International Church Kids Work

Parents and caregivers,

In order to provide a safe, healthy environment for all our children, we ask that you:

Keep your child at home or with you if he or she exhibits any of the following symptoms:

- sore throat
- fever within the previous 24 hours
- vomiting within the previous 24 hours
- diarrhea within the previous 24 hours
- runny nose with any coloured/cloudy discharge
- any skin infection or unexplained rash
- pink eye and other eye infections
- persistent earache
- cold sores (only for babies and toddlers age 3 and below)
- any symptoms of infections or childhood diseases such as chicken pox, pinkeye, ringworm, head lice, measles, mumps, scarlet fever, whooping cough, mononucleosis, strep throat, thrush, hand-foot-mouth disease

If your child exhibits any of these symptoms while in our care, we will notify you so that you can come pick up your child.

Extra info

- Our kids workers are not allowed to administer any medication to any child. If your child regularly takes medication you are welcome to personally administer it when necessary.
- If your child is being treated with antibiotics we ask that he or she be on that medication for at least 24 hours prior to returning to the Redeemer kids programme.
- If your child has a continually clear runny nose or rash due to **non-contagious** allergies, please let your child's kids work leader know.

Glossary (Dutch terms)

Sore throat: *zere keel*

Fever: *koorts*

Vomiting/diarrhea: *overgeven/diarree*

Runny nose: *loopneus*

Skin infection or rash: *huidinfectie of uitslag*

Pink eye or other eye infections: *bindvliesontsteking of andere oogsonsteking*

Persistent earache: *aanhoudende oorpijn*

Cold sore: *koortslip*

Chicken pox: *waterpokken*

Ringworm: *ringworm*

Head lice: *hoofdluis*

Measles: *mazelen*

Mumps: *bof*

Scarlet fever: *roodvonk*

Whooping cough: *kinkhoest*

Strep throat: *keelonsteking*

Thrush: *schimmelinfectie*

Hand-foot-mouth disease: *Hand-voet mondziekte*
